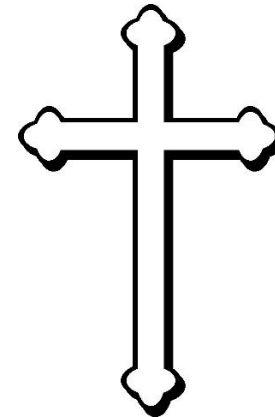

Emmanuel Church Cemetery

For those who will be placing flowers at the grave of a loved one, please do not place real flowers, as they die within a couple of days. Artificial Flowers are the best choice.

Flowers are to be placed either on top of the headstone, or within 10" of the head-stone, not behind the headstone.

Planting flowers in front of the headstone is not recommended. This makes it very difficult for the person mowing the grounds and they do not last long due to the summer heat and the deer enjoying them for their lunch.

Glass containers/ornaments are NOT permitted in the cemetery. They break easily and visitors cut their feet on the broken glass.
